 The 2014 Sussex County Championships and Age Group competition already set some records before it had even started:

Eighteen clubs entered a total of 591 swimmers into 3,179 individual swims. There were 18 boys and 18 girls events with 7 age groups in each and the long distance events had the highest ever entry. A total of 176 relay teams were entered into 12 different relay events.

- What can be said about the 2014 Sussex County Age Groups and Championshipsabsolutely fantastic by everyone that took part.
- We started on a high from Session 1 with our first Long Distance medal from Jo Chrismas and we ended on a huge climax with Daniel Brooks getting a Junior County Championship Record for the 100m Breaststroke.
- Special praise must go to all our 6 individual medallists who obtained 27 medals between them...



- Daniel [4 Bronze, 5 Silver & 5 Gold plus breaking the 100m Junior Championship Record]; Harrison [3 Bronze & 2 Silver]; Jacob [2 Silver & 1 Gold]; Andrew H-T [2 Silver] and not forgetting the girls Jo [1 Silver] and Hannah [2 Silver].
- Silver for Men's 4x100m Medley Relay [Ryan, Harrison, Daniel & Thomas]
- Bronze for Men's 4x100m Free Relay [Harrison, Andrew H-T, Thomas & Ryan]





- ...Not forgetting the 4th position for both of the Girls A team 9yrs Medley Relay and 9yrs Free Relay [Robyn, Ania, Kiera & Tegan]!
- In the 14yrs and under Bagcat Competition, Jack F, Jacob, Hannah & Jo all managed a top 10 position in their respective age groups.
- Overall Beacon SC came 9th in the Age Group Competition & 9th in the Overall Championship behind some of the Strongest & Biggest Clubs in the Sussex.

You all should be immensely proud of all that you have achieved through your hard work.

STATISTICS

- There were one or more Beacon swimmers in 41 of the 46 available events.
- 36 Beacon members, who entered, managed to compete in 197 swims and achieved a staggering 137 PB's.
- This gave 28 Finalists; 27 individual medals & 2 team medals.
- There were 112 top 4-8 places heats/finals
- There were 23 New or Improved Regional Qualifying times
- Only 3DQ's.
 - ...Probably one of the best results in these annual Champs that Beacon SC has achieved for many a recent year!!

Sussex League Gala #1

Beacon Swimming Club victorious in return to Sussex Swimming League.

- After an absence of over 15 years, to the Sussex Swimming League team Beacon stormed the first gala against Eastbourne and Bognor Regis Swimming Clubs.
- Despite Eastbourne being seeded number two in the Division, and having convincingly beaten Chichester Swimming Club by over 100 points in the previous Sussex League Gala, Beacon were dominant throughout the gala taking the lead after 10 events and eventually winning the Gala after 55 events with 428 points to Eastbourne's 373 points and with Bognor Regis third with 201 points.
- The victory for Beacon in its first Sussex League Gala in many years demonstrates the growing strength at the Club and its desire to be one of the top competitive swimming clubs in Sussex. The next Sussex Swimming League Gala for Beacon is against Hailsham and Chichester Swimming Clubs on 26th April.

 13 Beacon swimmers travelled to Littlehampton to take part in Splash into 2014 Littlehampton SC Open Meet. They completed 35 swims gaining 9 PB's with 2 improved County Qualifying times [only 1 DQ]. Considering this is the first meet following the Christmas Break it was a good effort with 13 of the swims gaining a top 3 placings.

 At Brighton SC Tom Handley Open Meet [level 2], the 17 Beacon swimmers who qualified for the event managed to produce some fantastic swims and results. Out of 53 swims, There were 25 PBs with 24 new/improved County Qualifying times & 5 new/improved Regional times [5 DQ].

Considering it was a small team representing the Club and against very strong teams from Sussex, Surrey and ...Kent, they managed to come 11th overall out of 23 teams.

Special mention should go to Harrison & Ryan who both qualified to compete in the 50m Skins event. Always an exciting event and although, they both courageously battled through the rounds, they were sadly knocked out before the final.

Well done to all of you who took part.

 January 18th Atlantis SC hosting the Seahawks Development Meet. Beacon had their largest entry for any meet with 44 swimmers entered into 155 events.

From this, the Club achieved 55 PB's, which gave 21 new County Qualifying times [3DQs]. A huge WELL DONE to all of you.

Our thanks must go to all those who helped out at this event from all 3 of the Clubs. It was a fantastic achievement by Beacon. Overall from those participating there were a total of 78 new County Qualifying times some 20% of the total entry. Seahawks is still proving to be worth while venture which Beacon is proud to be a member.

 Sunday 2nd Feb saw 12 Beacon Swimmers make the journey to Horsham for the Atlantis Regional-National Chaser Level 2 Open Meet. Beacon had a good showing, swimming in 27 races and between them they achieved 10 PBs, and 11 new or improved County Qualifying times. [No DQs]. This gave them 9 top 3 placings which is a fab achievement considering the level & quality of this meet. Well done to you all....

Congratulations to Jo for breaking the 5 minutes for 400m free & commiserations to Jacob for his 1:00.01 for 100m free. So so close to the huge barrier of sub 60 for the 100m – you'll get it next time for sure

Inter club galas

 On Saturday 22nd February Beacon team took part in Crawley Swimming Club's Alice Dauncey Trophy Gala at K2.

This is an annual Gala but with a twist as it is a time capped – so each race has a time and if a swimmer is faster than that time are given a "Speeding ticket" and awarded no points. However, Coaches like too see Swimmers race hard & the tickets are seen as a good achievement.

The Gala saw a team of... 28 Beacon swimmers, some of whom were swimming in unfamiliar events and for some it was their very first interclub gala. Suffice to say that from 32 individual races they posted 17 PB's & had 7 Speeding Tickets. It was a closely fought Gala which saw Crawley the eventual winners with 194 points, 2nd East Grinstead 188 Points, 3rd Beacon 171 points, Worthing, Atlantis and Shiverers. Well done to all of you who took part.

- Saturday Feb 15th saw 12 swimmers from Beacon represent their respective schools at the Sussex Secondary School Championships at Horsham. They qualified for 26 swims and of the 24 they achieved 13 PB's, 12 Improved County Qualifying times & 4 New or Improved Regional times.
- Special mention must go to Harrison for winning the Seniors [16+ yrs] 100m Breastroke & 200 IM and Daniel for winning the Int...ermediate [14-15 yrs] 100m Fly. As winners, this qualifies them to progress to the next round of the Schools Championship as part of the Sussex Schools team.

Well Done to you all, the standard of the meet was good as most of the top County swimmers were taking part.

British Gas South Zonal Long Course Champs 2014

 One weekend in January saw Ryan, Harrison & Daniel travel to Millfield to compete in the British Gas South Zonal Long Course Champs 2014. This is a very high Level 1 competition & all three swam extremely well. They managed to qualify for 4 finals between them - Daniel achieved 6th place in 16yr/under 200m Breastroke, Harrison 8th in 17yrs&over 100m Breastroke & 4th in 17yrs&over 50m Breastroke, Ryan 8th 17&over 50m Backstroke. From the resulting 11 swims they obtained 6 PB's, 2 new/improved County times & 6 Regional times.

This was a fantastic achievement by these senior members of the Club & all 3 are only fractions off achieving National Youth times. Well Done.

SUSSESX SEAHAWKS SWIM TEAM

- Beacon SC is continuing to work with fellow Seahawks Clubs, Atlantis SC and East Grinstead SC. Now the County Championships are over the priority is for the Coaches to get together followed by a full Seahawks Committee Meeting to plan for the year ahead including the forthcoming South East Regional Championship and the National Championships in the summer. Details on training opportunities and membership for the new season will also be on the agenda. From the 7 Beacon swimmers who participated in racing the 800m & 1500m events (a few racing these distance for first time) there were 7 PB's & 4 new County Qualifying times, sadly 2 of the other times were just shy of the QCT but there is still time. Fantastic & a humungous effort by all who swam.

Long Course Training (50m pool)

- It is a long way from one end of the pool to the other!
- With the exception of August and in December when the Club Championships will be held, it is likely that there will be 50m training sessions at K2 every month as this form of training is now firmly established as part of the Club training programme. To give swimmers the best possible preparation the dates are all geared around various galas and Championships.
- One session will be for Seahawks swimmers and the others by invitation and invites are usually sent out a couple of weeks in advance with the aim being to give as many swimmers as possible the opportunity to experience this type of training.
